Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

“When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you.” Isaiah 43:2a

As I followed the voyage of M/V Sea Haven, checking daily weather and relaying this to her Captain, Nob Kalau on their journey from Pohnpei through the Chuuk outer-islands and ultimately, Guam; these verses enabled me to trust that the Lord will guide them safely to their destinations. With two typhoons in our area – and thus affecting the swells and currents in their vicinity, Nob confirmed that it was indeed rough sailing for them for the first 18 hours to Puluwat. These were sleepless nights for him, when every two hours he had to check the engines 24/7 and be on the bridge to stand watch. The Lord enabled them to arrive at the precise time at which they could go into Puluwat’s channel. Had they been delayed a few minutes, they would not have made it – and therefore would have delayed their tour! The Sea Haven travelled 1,090 nautical miles and was able to deliver 3 – 40 ft. container full of school furniture to island Elementary, Junior High and High schools, through the generous donation of IRN – delivered to us on containers through the generosity of Matson Shipping. We also delivered pallets of school materials donated through Ayuda Foundation. Indeed the work of the Lord is not the work of just one man or one organization. And we thank God for our partners!

PHILIPPINES. Praise God, the PMF church building in Catmon has now a roof, solid flooring, and new pews and church furniture made of hard wood. Even if the church is not yet finished, this has not stopped the congregation, led by their Pastor Cesar – to meet every Sunday for Worship and for week day activities such as Bible study and prayer. Please continue to pray for strength for both Cesar and his father in law, Polo – as they plan to complete construction by end of September.

BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN, MINDORO, PHILIPPINES. We rejoice that once again, Bahay Kalinga has been awarded its Certificate of Accreditation having satisfactorily complied with the standards in the implementation of residential-based programs and services for children. With it, we were also given the Registration Certificate and License to Operate for satisfactorily complying with the requirements to operate a social welfare and development agency implementing Residential Care Program for abandoned, neglected and orphaned children. Both certificates were issued by the Philippines’ Department of Social Welfare and Development, and both certificates are valid until 2018!

PALAU. “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding, in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight.” (Proverbs 3:5-6). This was the theme verse for the 19th church anniversary of PMF Palau. As a church family, we have experienced many challenges, and these were encouraging words indeed!

God's presence was experienced by each one that Sunday morning. We began with worship songs that radiated the awesomeness of a dependable God who saves. Praises and prayers were lifted to God and an especially encouraging message was given by one of our elders. The sermon reminded the congregation that we are just like sheep, feeble, vulnerable, and frail. But the good news is that we have a great Shepherd! This Shepherd protects the sheep, and saves them from the attacks of the enemy. The sheep could always and should always trust the Shepherd. The stage background was designed by our talented volunteers with the words, "In God We Trust". T-shirts worn by many that morning showed the same theme design. A pot-bless lunch after the worship service was enjoyed by church members and visitors as we fellowshiped together.

YAP, MICRONESIA. "Excuse me, is there going to be VBS again this summer?" is a question that many of us at the PMF church get asked nowadays by Outer Island kids excited to attend. For the past three years, our church has strived to reach out to these kids and their families by holding an evangelistic Vacation Bible School program in their outer island language. And each year as the word spreads, more and more children and their parents are responding favorably to it. This summer we had our highest turnout so far, with 120 children attending! The theme was "The Fruit of the Spirit", and the kids enthusiastically memorized the key verse, Galatians 5:22 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." The PMF team was made up of our pastor Petrus' family, and many adult and youth volunteers, who all worked incredibly hard to make this VBS memorable for the kids. They also learned a lot about exhibiting the fruit of the Spirit (namely patience!) while taking care of so many children! On the closing day of VBS, the parents were invited to see for themselves what their children had learned during the week.
