Right now, we are still working on the renewal of our license and waiting for one document from SEC. We are also working on our accreditation which is due this month. REPUBLIC OF PALAU. October has been an eventful month, full of celebrations and crazy weather. We kicked off the month celebrating Palau Independence Day with boat races and fireworks. We ended the month with our church PMF partnering with the Palau Evangelical Church to host a Celebrate Jesus Night on the 31st to give kids a better alternative to scary costumes. In the middle of the month, we got to participate in Angaur Liberation Day which is a great way to spend time celebrating and playing games with the people that we are here to serve. Our biggest

celebration, however, is that our aircraft ground handler, Julius, just got engaged, congratulations Julius and Zora!

With the Islander back in operation, **Brock, Jun, and Melody** have been hard at work on the major overhaul needed to get the Queen Air N46MA, up and running again. This includes installing a new engine, replacing major parts of the landing gear system, and finishing the upgrade of the avionics. All the parts and work for this project are expensive, so we thank God for His provision in increasing the demand for scenic flights which help provide funds for the non-revenue services we provide. **By Melody Coleman**
