BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN, OR. MINDORO, PHILIPPINES. Here is part of a year ender report from Micah Oda, our Center Head: "To date we have cared for 442 children – with 67 of them surrendered (Parents who have relinquished their parental rights and given the children to PMA BK for adoption). Children for temporary shelter and have since been returned to their families. Adoptive families include, here in the Philippines: Palawan, Occidental Mindoro, Laguna and Manila, the United States: Oregon, Colorado, Nebraska, among others and families from Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Australia, France, Italy, Spain, Canada and Netherland. Praise God for the love and tender care BK has given to the children in our care, thanks to all our Caregivers, Social Worker and Center Head!

REPUBLIC OF PALAU. January is always a busy month because the weather gets windy and rainy causing the boats to cancel. We are so glad that God has provided the means for us to fly the people as an alternative to boat transportation. We also have had an increase in scenic flights as tourism slowly picks back up in Palau. We are thankful for God's provision through these flights. Unfortunately, the summer house and tree house that we built in Angaur for Bible study lost their structural integrity because of termites. We have taken them both down, and the PMA/PMF men are rebuilding them with concrete posts which will protect against termites in the future. One victory is that we got one of our Cessna 206s back in the air after some major repairs to the wing. Brock is in Australia this week overseeing the overhaul of one of our King Air engines. -Melody Coleman

YAP, MICRONESIA. We had a successful trip to Woleai to begin salvage of N44MA which had crashed on takeoff last July. We spent a day and a half disassembling as much as we could. With limited tools, we accomplished much more than we expected and were able to bring a lot of undamaged parts back with us which we will use as spares for our other Queen Air (N46MA) which is the identical twin sister to N44MA.
