We have a God who loves us and has rescued us from sin and the ravages of it. He has promised that He will not forget us! Upon their return to the island, they trained all the Sunday school teachers and their assistants and re-echoed their training from Manila. There were 24 ladies representing our 9 PMF churches and Pastor Bryan from PMF Patnanungan. All the VBS classes will start this May and we pray and look forward to the many children who will be reached and taught with the Gospel message. We pray that their hearts will be open to receive Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior. Will you please pray with us?

BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN OR. MINDORO, PHILIPPINES. A Big praise to the Lord! BK has been Accredited by the Department of Social Welfare, once more, for another
