Our most recent sea search began on Friday, January 23rd when a boat was flipped over by a large wave during its attempt to depart from Angaur. We were able to transport the survivors that same night to Koror for those injured to receive care from the hospital. We then continued searching for a missing individual until January 27th. Unfortunately, there were multiple lives lost in this event, and we were unable to locate the missing person.
