Upon arrival, he checked in at the U.S. Naval Hospital, where he received the proper evaluation and treatment. The medical team was able to give a clear prognosis, administer the right medication, and monitor his recovery. After just two days, Mark was well enough to be discharged—already showing strong signs of improvement. While in Guam, he also completed the required drug test for pilots and passed with flying colors. Mark has since returned to Yap and is already back in service—strong enough to pilot a medevac flight from Palau to the Philippines and co-pilot the flight back to Palau. What a remarkable turnaround. Praise the Lord for His healing, His timing, and His faithful care over those who serve Him.

BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN, OR. MINDORO PHILIPPINES. Fourteen-day-old Jana, a baby girl from the Mangyan community in Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro, was welcomed into the care of Bahay Kalinga Naujan on March 13, 2026. Her case was referred by MSWDO Social Worker Ms. Ilaga after an informal placement by her biological parents prompted the need for proper protection and temporary shelter. Despite her challenging start, Jana arrived healthy and peacefully asleep, small but strong, with thick black hair and calm

disposition. Her newborn screening and medical checkup were completed the same day, confirming she was in good health. She had also received her BCG vaccine earlier on March 10. Now 24 days old, Jana continues to thrive under attentive care. She feeds well on formula, sleeps soundly, and rarely cries. Her caregiver gently introduces her to her new environment, including morning sunlight to support her growth. From a vulnerable beginning, Jana is steadily finding safety, stability, and the nurturing environment every child deserves. **By: Richelle Venturina**
