PATNANUNGAN, PHILIPPINES. From Pastor Bryan: Our town recently experienced a four-day power outage. Because most water refilling stations had no generators, they were unable to produce drinking water. This opened an unexpected opportunity for our soon-to-open water refilling station to serve the community. With our generator, we were able to supply clean drinking water to Patnanungan Sur and Busdak for three consecutive days. Nearly 1,000 containers (five gallons each) were distributed free of charge. We are grateful to the Local Government Unit for covering the generator fuel cost and to the local personnel who helped announce the distribution, collect containers, and deliver water to every purok. Residents expressed heartfelt gratitude, as did our Municipal Mayor. This outreach also introduced our upcoming water refilling station, and many shared that they plan to become regular customers. Even the Rural Health Unit and Municipal Police Station intend to order their drinking water from us. Above all, we thank the Lord for His favor and for the positive response from the community. This has become another testimony of how, in times of need, we can serve both spiritually and practically.

BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, OR. MINDORO, PHILIPPINES. John and James, siblings who entered PMA–Bahay Kalinga on May 3, 2021, have grown up in our care since they were just 1 year and 6 months old

and 2 months old. They were entrusted to PMA-BK during a difficult time, as their father struggled to provide for them after the passing of their mother. Over the years, the boys were lovingly cared for by the houseparents, social worker, and center head. Their family situation was thoroughly assessed, and every possible option within their biological family was explored. Their maternal grandfather, was eventually located, but due to age and financial limitations, he was unable to assume responsibility. In 2024, the siblings were declared legally available for adoption. Now 7 years old and 5 years and 5 months old, John and James have spent most of their young lives at PMA-BK, growing into two hopeful and loving brothers. On July 23, 2026, their case was presented for intercountry adoption, and the Child Placement Committee raised no objection. They are now one step closer to finding their forever family as they await acceptance from their prospective adoptive parents. Please pray.
